16.Multidisciplinary / interdisciplinary

1. Multidisciplinary education would enable students to develop a holistic understanding of the subject and help in nurturing the ability to think critically and creatively. In line with this recommendation of NEP, the University is taking steps for restructuring of curriculum and adoption of appropriate pedagogic approaches. The curriculum in the compulsory courses of Doctoral Programme has been framed to enhance the breadth of understanding, research skills and awareness of emerging facets of knowledge from different disciplines.

17.Academic bank of credits (ABC):

2. The University is according primacy to the innovative paradigm of Academic Bank of Credits as envisioned in NEP. It is preparing in this direction for necessary statutory amendments to University Act. It is working with other Universities in the state for implementation of this policy measure.

18.Skill development:

3. The University is focusing on skill development for promotion of employability among the graduates. Emphasis is laid on IT Skill development through restructured MCA curriculum. Certificate courses on Cyber Security and Data Science are being offered as suggested by UGC. The compulsory course on Research Methodology in Ph.D. Programme is also being offered to hone the Research Skills and Publication Ethics, develop increased awareness about open access and familiarize with Software and Databases for carrying out research among the scholars.

19.Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course)

4. Department of Telugu in main campus is helping in the translation requirements of the faculty and staff from social science and science departments for teaching learning in vernacular. Yoga training on regular basis is taken by the Department of Physical Education. Necessary support is extended and Staff and Students are encouraged to undergo twelve weeks Yoga Practices MOOCS Course being offered by Swami Vivekananda Yoga Anusandhana Samstha, Bangalore.

5. Learning Outcomes drive Curriculum, Instruction & Evaluation. Learning outcomes being holistic and comprehensive, usher in competency-based curriculum and outcome-based education. The University has paid utmost attention to incorporation of learning outcomes such as programme outcomes and course outcomes while framing the curriculum of different academic programmes. As recommended in NEP, the University is taking steps for use of appropriate pedagogy and learning outcome-based performance evaluation.

6. The University is availing the benefit of vast number of online courses from UGC SWAYAM portal and other established platforms. Impetus has been given to Moocs to expand the study options, means of credit transfer and learning resource base for students. These are also coming in handy for the capacity building programmes for Faculty. YouTube Channel has been widely used for uploading learning resources by the faculty of the University for the wider outreach of learning community.

M.Sc. Chemistry as well as M.Sc. Integrated Chemistry programmes

offer a new subject called 'Green Chemistry' to bring home the Primacy of Sustainability Perspective.

The cross-cutting issues of Human Values and Professional ethics have been harmoniously interwoven into the Curriculum framework of Palamuru University. Research and Publication Ethics a compulsory two credit course in Ph.D. course work helps to understand the importance of being ethical in carrying out research and publication activities. The topic of Gandhian Studies in M.A. Political Science Programme drives home the importance of universal values of truth, non-violence, peace, respect for democracy and diversity, simple living and ethical behaviour.

2.2 - Catering to Student Diversity

2.2.1 - The institution assesses the learning levels of the students and organises special Programmes for advanced learners and slow learners

Palamuru University pays attention to assessment which helps the teachers concerned to know where a student is exactly, along the learning progression and path to academic success.

A component of class room teaching includes subjective assessment of whether a student understands the concept or can apply the materials being taught. The teachers concerned devotes time to ascertain more about the students in terms of their academic background, aptitude and learning needs. This helps in using the

differentiated instruction to cater to diverse learning needs of the students. The University accords priority for mainstreaming the slow learners.

It arranges preliminary communication skills classes for the benefit of students hailing from rural areas and vernacular background. Tutorials are conducted on a planned basis for the advanced learners where as remedial instruction for the slow learners.

Special/ extra classes are held for slow learners after the class hours on weekdays. The concerns of slow learners are addressed through counselling, social facilitation and academic advice.

The University devises pathways for academic enrichment of advanced learners. They are encouraged to prepare for higher studies and participate in research pursuits. Anchor activities such as paper presentations are envisaged to foster self-reflection among advanced learners.

Experiential learning forms an integral part of the course structure

and teaching methodology in a number of Programmes. Internships, field visits, project work and service learning through Community engagement find increased application in MSW, MBA, MCA, M.Ed., Pharmacy, M.Com, M.Sc. Botany, M.Sc. integrated Chemistry programmes. Practicals as the live medium of experiential learning constitute the core of science and other programmes.

Instruction through group tasks is done through varied forms of group discussions, group presentations, group assignments, projects and peer learning which provide

platform for active participation of students in classroom learning. Case study method is also employed in participative learning scenario to stimulate critical thinking and awareness of multiple perspectives. MCA, MBA, MSW and M.Ed. programmes play a major role in deploying this methodology.

Active learning through problem-solving exercises, project, case studies, role play simulations, games, quizzes, seminars, poster presentations and assignments is being pursued vigorously in many Departments. The students are also provided opportunities for research projects during summer vacation. Research as a Pedagogic skill is providing an optimum learning environment for exploration and joyful learning

2.3.2 - Teachers use ICT enabled tools including online resources for effective teaching and learning processes during the year

Palamuru University has successfully embarked upon the Blended Teaching - Learning in the wake of Carona Pandemic. In doing so wherever possible both high-tech and low-tech approaches have been deployed by the teachers to support student learning. Such technology interventions have come in handy to enhance teacher engagement with students through improved access to content, data and networks. The free blended learning platform of Google Class room has been deployed for sharing of files between teachers

and students. These includes lesson plans, Assignments, PPTs, Study Material, Mode of Evaluation and Course Completion Certificate. The video conferencing tools of Google Meet, Zoom and Web-X have been used depending upon the convenience of teachers and students concerned. Wherever possible Moodle Platform was also used as Learning Management System. The teachers have been using the ICT integrated tools for teaching and evaluations.

In addition to facilitating hybrid instruction, technological adaptations have also come in handy for the sustenance of academic activity during the Pandemic. Availing the benefit from UGC SWAYAM portal and other established sources, Impetus has been given to Moocs to expand the study options, means of credit transfer and learning resource base for students.

There is timeliness in the issue of examination notifications through strict adherence to the almanac.

Scope for malpractices is ruled out at the examination centres through due diligence in identification, allotment of examination centres.

Smooth conduct of examinations is ensured through deployment of observers and squads for overseeing the process.

Confidentiality is ensured through coding of answer scripts in valuation.

Fairness and probity is ensured through adoption of standardized procedures for valuation.

There is regularity in the declaration of results through adherence

to time limit of 30 days.

Access to justice is ensured through institution of Appeals Mechanism after the declaration of results.

There is improvement of efficiency in operations through online student registration, processing of examination applications, online generation and dispatch of hall tickets.

The Digital initiative of online dispatch of question papers to examination centres with a protected password is helping in overcoming logistic difficulties and delays.

There is improvement of efficiency in valuation process through online entry of marks by evaluators at the spot valuation centre and automation of results processing.

2.6 - Student Performance and Learning Outcomes

2.6.1 - The institution has stated learning outcomes (generic and programme specific)/graduate attributes which are integrated into the assessment process and widely publicized through the website and other documents

Palamuru University has formulated Graduate Attributes which bring home the philosophy underpinning the teaching programmes being offered by it.

Programme and programme specific outcomes are prepared for each of the academic programmes being offered by the University. Course outcomes are spelt out in detail for the individual subjects/ papers as specified in the Curriculum of the respective academic programme.

Graduate Attributes as well as Programme outcomes, programme specific outcomes and course outcomes are displayed on the website of the University and printed in the Handbook. These are circulated among the Faculty of the concerned Departments as well. Programme outcomes being germane to academic agenda and path of student progression are explained to students at the time of orientation programme. The students are familiarized with programme specific outcomes soon after their reporting at the respective Departments. Course outcomes are explained to them at the commencement of each semester.

2.6.2 - Attainment of Programme outcomes, Programme specific outcomes and course outcomes are evaluated by the institution during the year

The University follows standardised procedure for measuring the learning outcomes comprising Program outcomes, Programme specific outcomes and course outcomes, across the different academic programmes. The calculation of the course outcomes attainments includes the performance in both the internal and external examinations.

The standard format for calculation is used in computing the course attainment values of these two sets of the examinations. Total course attainment values are worked out based on the due weightages assigned to internal and external examinations by the university (This is presently in the ratio of 20% and 80%, and in some programmes like M.Ed. 30% weightage to internals and 70% weightage to the university exam).

Course attainment scores signify the target values achieved in a given course/subject. Since the course outcomes are mapped substantially into programme specific objectives and programme objectives, the attainment levels of course outcomes are accorded due importance.

The attainment values of course outcomes for both internal and external examinations are presented in a tabular form. Standardised computation is used in this process.

INFRASTRUCTURE AND LEARNING RESOURCES

4.1 - Physical Facilities

4.1.1 - The institution has adequate facilities for teaching - learning. viz., classrooms, laboratories, computing equipment, etc.

Palamuru University has been augmenting requisite facilities for strengthening teaching learning processes and creating conducive ambience for scholarly pursuits in consonance with specified requirements of the concerned statutory bodies. There are 87 class rooms with latest furniture and 32 well equipped Laboratories including PG Centres.

In addition, three well equipped common computer laboratories with 25 systems each are setup for subject specific requirements.

There are separate Digital Language Laboratories with 35 systems each at the Department of English and at the Centre for English Language Training (CELT) for the wider purpose of computer assisted English language learning to improve communicative English.

Besides, a general purpose computer laboratory with 25 systems to promote information literacy and direct access for learning resources among the students has been setup at the central library of the University.

In all 365 computers with requisite software and updated configurations are available at Palamuru University.

4.1.2 - The institution has adequate facilities for cultural activities, yoga, games (indoor, outdoor) and sports. (gymnasium, yoga centre, auditorium, etc.)

Palamuru University has created good amenities for the promotion of games and sports as well as cultural activities to facilitate holistic development of the students. Integrated Sports Complex , established in the year 2015 has facilities for indoor games of Badminton (area 455 sq.mts) , Table Tennis (Area 154 Sq.Mts.), Caroms (Area 91 Sq. Mts.), and Chess (Area 91 Sq. Mts.).

The sports complex also houses well equipped Gymnasium/Fitness centre (Area 88 Sq. Mts.) as well as Yoga centre (Area 88 Sq. Mts.)

The facilities for outdoor games and sports include Volleyball, Badminton, Ball , Badminton, Tennicoit, Kabaddi, Kho-Kho. There are facilities for track and field events which include, 200 M athletic Track for Running Events, Jumping pit for Long Jump, Triple Jump and High Jump, Throwing sectors for shotput, Discus Throw and Javelin Throw.

Three well equipped auditoria with a seating capacity of about 300 members each for the conduct of the cultural and literary festivals,

competitions and related events. Open air theatre (Vikasapranganam) for staging cultural events are available at the University Campus.

Construction of Synthetic Basketball Court and Synthetic Matting of Badminton Court as well as Laying of Synthetic Athletic Track are in progress.

The campus college buildings are in close proximity. The student Hostels (for both Boys & Girls) at main campus as well as at PG Centers are at a walking distance and are provided with dining, common rooms and recreational facilities. There are Ramps for the convenience of Differently-abled students. The sprawling Sports Complex provides Gym, Yoga and Games (indoor & outdoor) facilities. Common room facility is available for Girls students and women employees at Colleges as well as at Administrative Building. Other Gender amity initiative includes installation of sanitary pads disposal machines at the Girls Hostel Complex. There is Health Centre at the main campus with provision of Medicines. Duty Doctor and supporting medical staff are available during college timings. Palamuru University is closed campus and round the clock security is in place.

Palamuru University is a green Campus nestled among the idyllic surroundings.

Impressive buildings, imposing main entrance, well laid down roads with foot paths and avenue plantation on either side enhance the overall ambience of the Campus.

IT policy of Palamuru University is formulated in consonance with UGC Guidelines and State Government Stipulations. The accent of IT Policy is on ensuring the availability of Internet Connectivity and computing facilities and procurement of requisite Software to meet the current and future requirements of Teaching Research and Consultants.

As a step in this direction Campus wide internet facility run with copper wire connection has been upgraded with fibre optics cable connectivity (OFC) under leasing from the BSNL to provide speedy data access in JULY 2017.

Installation of JUNIPER M10 router for connectivity with National Knowledge Network (NKN) has been taken up to provide seamless access to knowledge resources in July 2017. Installation of Firewall - Sonic WALL TZ600 has been done for providing Internet security to computer systems from Malware, Offensive websites and Hacking and Malicious intrusions etc. in March - 2017.

Expansion of IT resources include upgradation of Wi-Fi Routers and installation of CC-Cameras to provide campus wide Wi-Fi facility to the staff and the students including the resident students in the Hostels in order to transform the University campus as a Wi-Fi enabled campus. This is being taken up through e-procurement process.

Water conservation has become the need of the hour. To this end, 8 rain water harvesting pits have been dug in strategic places to collect rain water and minimise runoff water.

Waste water is used for gardening purposes. Water taps are regulated

towards water conservation.

Wherever possible rooftop rain water harvesting has also been undertaken.

Implementation of Rainwater harvesting on campus is yielding positive results for augmenting water supply. Reduction of dependence on water tankers is minimised. Replacement and recharge of ground water is significantly improved. Rainwater harvesting is coming in handy for waste water recycling in big way.

1. Formulation of Research Policy:

IQAC of the University has facilitated the formulation of Research Policy as a guide to action. This helps the University to coordinate the research pursuits by individual faculty and set norms for undertaking sponsored research from National Funding Agencies and through Industry and International Collaborations. The Policy seeks to check the menace of misconduct and Plagiarism in research and give impetus to ethical academic publishing. Research Policy lays emphasis on generation and promotion of intellectual capital through patents and IPR.

6.5.3 - Incremental improvements made for the preceding during the year with regard to quality (in

case of first cycle) Post accreditation quality initiatives(second and subsequent cycles)

Palamuru University has undertaken intensive coaching Programs for competitive examinations through PU Study Circle with impetus from the Telangana State Council of Higher Education. These include preparation for police recruitment (SI& police constable) wherein nearly 150 candidates have enrolled and about 70 qualified, Group I&II services, availed by equal number of candidates and TET wherein 100 candidates have enrolled and upto 80 have qualified. Presently, training for physical fitness is being imparted to the written test qualified police recruitment candidates in coordination with the Physical Education Department.

1. Impetus to Sports Integrated Learning

Palamuru University is conscious of the need for mainstreaming the sports integrated learning in our higher education system. The National Education Policy has also laid a roadmap for the holistic integration of three paradigms of Physical Education, Fitness and Yoga for the promotion of health, wellness and overall personality development, into the mainstream higher education towards the ideal of Fit India. As a step in this direction, Doctoral program in Physical Education has been launched during the current academic year. Alongside the university is developing sports infrastructure in a big way with financial support under Khelo India project.

It is to be noted that universities, especially residential campuses as the primary settings for promoting optimal learning and holistic development of the students invariably do play a powerful role in influencing students health related behaviours. In this context, profiling of students health data assumes significance for improving both health and education outcomes.

Practice:

Health Profile of students is done on select parameters at the university health centre under the medical supervision. Health parameters are mapped through the administration of Handheld BMI machine.

Evidence of Success: There is overwhelming response from the students for this health intervention. District Red cross, Mahbubnagar is evincing interest in availing student blood grouping data for purposes of blood donation. Computerized health profile sheets of students provide rich database for the university. This institutional intervention ensuring student engagement and community involvement holds promise and potential for sustaining enduring health practices in educational settings.

7.3 - Institutional Distinctiveness

7.3.1 - Highlight the performance of the institution in an area distinct to its priority and thrust (within a maximum of 200 words)

Promotion of Sports Integrated Learning & Development of Sports Infrastructure

Academic success and sports together form strong foundation for the holistic development of the students. Considering this cross curricular potential and symbiosis, Palamuru University continues to accord primacy to games and sports to churn out well-rounded graduates. Such an intervention is in tune with its mission of broad basing higher education. Accordingly, as follow-up action on the academic front, New Department of Physical Education has been carved out. Doctoral program in sports science has also been introduced to give big push to scholarly academic pursuits in this arena.

Imbued with the spirit of Khelo India initiative, the university has embarked upon the modernization of sports infrastructure in a big way. Construction of Synthetic Basketball Court and Synthetic Matting of Badminton Court taken up at a cost of Rs 21 lakhs are in progress. Besides, Laying of Synthetic Athletic Track at an estimated cost of Rs 9crores envisaged under Khelo India project has also been initiated.

Palamuru University is a member of Association of Indian

Universities (AIU) from 2013-14 onwards and deputes teams in 23 events (Men & Women) at South Zone Inter University and All India levels.

7.3.2 - Plan of action for the next academic year

1. Submission of SSR

Submission of SSR during the year 2022-23 holds the key for the institutional journey of quality sustenance. During this transitional phase of preparation for 2nd Cycle, special attention needs to be paid the revised format of SSR incorporating the implementation aspects of NEP.

2.Preparation for Reaccreditation

Systematic Preparation for Reaccreditation exercise (2nd Cycle of Accreditation) is high on the agenda of the University for the next year. The revised format of Reaccreditation calls for closer examination of ongoing quality systems and processes at the University.

3.Smart Classrooms

Palamuru University is keen on augmenting Learning Infrastructure for effective teaching and students' engagement with learning. In this direction, Smart Classrooms will be setup at three Auditoria and one Seminar Hall at campus and one unit at each District PG centres (03).

4.Central Research Facility

Central Research facility is envisaged to evolve an ecosystem for creation and dissemination of knowledge and to facilitate campus wide interdisciplinary research pursuits on a coordinated basis. This integrated facility to be housed in a spacious building comprising high-end laboratories, state-of-the-art equipment, sophisticated instrumentation, testing and analytical services will give big boost to sponsored research and consultancy.
